ALABAMA COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM

NURSING CURRICULUM

The nursing curriculum is a concept-based curriculum that reflects the stated mission and philosophy of the Alabama Community College System (ACCS) Nursing Programs. To prepare graduates in the role of practical nurse, the ACCS and the Alabama Board of Nursing developed a mobility track designed to bridge previously gained healthcare knowledge, skills and abilities of the military veteran and/or Paramedic with the education for a practical nursing certificate after successful completion of NUR 120 Health Care Transition and NUR 115 Evidence Based Clinical Reasoning.

The mobility course, NUR 120 – Healthcare Transition focuses on bridging previously gained health care knowledge, skills and abilities to assist military veterans to transition into the role of practical nurse. Emphasis in this course is placed on evidence based clinical decision making and nursing concepts provided in a family and community context for a variety of health alterations across the lifespan.

The nursing curriculum design is based on conceptual learning to facilitate transfer of knowledge, facilitate collaborative and active learning, focus on problems, foster systematic observations, focus on nursing actions and interdisciplinary efforts and foster understanding of relationships. Concepts are lined to each other while presenting exemplars of concepts. This approach helps learners to extrapolate meanings from one concept to another and identify commonalities.

When delivering direct patient care, students are supervised by faculty. In the campus nursing laboratory, simulation and instruction are directed through hands-on practice and facilitate by personal contact and by visual, computer-assisted, interactive and other multimedia stimuli.

The faculty strives to produce graduates capable of self –direction, who are willing to assume responsibility and accountability for their practice in the health care delivery system.

Military Medic Veteran/Paramedic Mobility - MINIMUM ADMISSION STANDARDS

Please check the following minimum admission standards before submitting your application.

___1. Unconditional admission to the college (Application must be updated if student did not attend BSCC the previous semester).

___2. Original transcripts **from all colleges** attended must be in the Office of Student Services by the nursing application deadline. Unlike routine college admission, the nursing department does not allow one semester to receive transcripts. Transcripts must be sent by the institution directly to the BSCC Central Records Office. Transferable course work must be completed at a regionally accredited college or university.

___3. An official military transcript or an active, unencumbered Alabama Paramedic licensure at the time of application is required (by the application deadline) to complete the admission process.

****Eligible military healthcare designation(s) include but are not limited to a veteran who has completed Basic Medical Technician Corpsman Program (Navy/Air Force), Air Force Independent Duty Medical Technician, or Army Health Care Specialist training.

___4. Military discharge (honorable) must be within the past five years unless the prospective student has been working in a health care area in a medical-surgical capacity since discharge. The final decision on “medical-surgical capacity” will be made based on written work verification from the student with the final decision being made by Bevill State’s Nursing Administration.

___5. A complete nursing mobility application must be submitted online via the BSCC college Website.

___6. A minimum of 18 ACT composite score (writing component not required), National or Residual, is required and ACT results must be attached to this application. There is no expiration date on ACT for this nursing application. ***ACT Scores from residual testing are valid only at the college and cannot be transferred by transcript or other means to any other institution or agency. The only exception is a waiver agreement between ACCS and ACT to allow the exchange of scores among the Alabama Community College System colleges.

___7. A minimum of 2.5 GPA is required on a 4.0 scale based on the nursing required academic core courses. The core college courses are English Composition 1, Intermediate College Algebra, Anatomy & Physiology I, Anatomy and Physiology II, Human Growth & Development, and Speech.

___8. Pre-requisite Courses:

- MTH 100 – Intermediate College Algebra, or higher level Math
- ENG 101 – English Composition
- BIO 201 – Human Anatomy & Physiology I (BSCC College pre-requisite is BIO 103)
- BIO 202 – Human Anatomy & Physiology II
- SPH 106/107 – Fundamentals of Speech
- PSY 210 – Human Growth & Development (BSCC College pre-requisite is PSY 200)

___9. Good standing with the College; including minimum overall, cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required.

___10. Meet the Health Science Essential Functions (verified by Health Care Provider).

___11. Name of application is current legal name and matches copy of photo ID and name in BSCC system.

POINTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO NURSING

After meeting all minimum admission requirements, applicants are rank ordered using the following point system:

- ACT composite national or residual score of (36 points maximum possible). The writing component is not required. No time limit on ACT results. Applicant will be awarded points for his/her composite ACT score. A minimum composite score of 18 on ACT is required for eligibility to apply. ACT results must be attached to the application.
- Points will be awarded for grades in English Composition I, Intermediate College Algebra, Anatomy & Physiology I and Anatomy and Physiology II. The following scale will be used to assign points: A=3 points, B= 2 points, C=1 point.
- Four points may be awarded, one point each for completion **at BSCC** of Microbiology, Human Growth & Development, Fundamentals of Speech, and a Humanities elective (Art or Music Appreciation, Philosophy, Ethics, Religion or foreign language) with a grade of C or higher.
- Two points will be awarded for students who have attended Beville State Community College for at least one semester (BSCC Loyalty points)
- Four points are awarded for completion (at BSCC or another institution/ university) of Chemistry, Pre-calculus/ Finite Math, English Composition II, or Statistics with a C or higher. Only four points total are awarded.

A total of 58 points are possible with these selection criteria. If there is a tie in points in relation to the number of available spaces, then the higher cumulative GPA will be considered.

High school students may obtain points for college courses through dual enrollment.

Military veterans to PN graduates who complete the concept based curriculum within one academic year from start of mobility program nursing courses, are exempt from taking NUR 209. These students can apply to enter the associate degree nursing mobility program at NUR 211.

Progression:

Students with two non-progressions in the mobility program must reapply and be accepted to start the nursing program from the beginning.
