IMPORTANT NOTES

REGARDING UNIVERSITY PARALLEL TRANSFER CREDITS: Please know that there are other transferrable courses from Southwest Tennessee Community College that will satisfy some of the requirements above. These particular courses are recommended so that a student might complete an AS degree through Southwest with courses that will fulfill Southwest’s General Education Program as well as transfer to The University of Mississippi.

REGARDING REQUIRED TEST SCORES: The University of Mississippi-Tupelo strongly recommends that students provide test scores before transferring and especially if applying for scholarships. Passing scores for the Praxis I PPST (Reading – 172 Writing – 173 Math – 172) or an appropriate ACT score (at least 21 composite with no subtest scores lower than 18) or SAT score (860 composite) are required for admission into the Teacher Education Program (TEP) and for most Education scholarships. Professional Education

Background Checks. All candidates in the School of Education must have a background check performed prior to beginning field experiences. Students may go to http://education.olemiss.edu/safe/background_check.html to begin the background check process. A fee of \$40 will be charged to the candidate. Only one background check is required while in the teacher education program. However, if a candidate is not enrolled at the University of Mississippi for more than one calendar year, a second background check will be required. If a background check reveals a criminal history, the candidate may not be allowed to participate in field experiences, which means he/she will not be able to complete the program.

Admission to Phase I of the Teacher Education Program (TEP)

Candidates can enter Phase I: Core Curriculum as an incoming freshman or by transferring with a minimum 2.5 GPA. Criteria for admission into phases two and three are described below.

Junior Level Phase I TEP Elementary Education Courses and Required Field Experiences (some Day Schedule)

Admission to Phase II of the Teacher Education Program (TEP)

1. Completion of Core curriculum and EDCI 352.
2. GPA of 2.75 or higher.
3. Appropriate scores on Praxis I, SAT, or ACT scores.
4. Must maintain a "C" or better in all professional education and general education courses.
5. EDCI 352 must be completed with a "C" or better to enroll in EDCI 353.

Admission to Phase III of the Teacher Education Program (TEP) – Student Teaching

1. Admission to Phase II: Professional Education Track
2. A minimum grade of "C" in professional education courses. If this minimum of "C" is not met, the course(s) must be retaken before enrolling in the next level of professional education courses.
3. Completion of all courses in the teaching field with a minimum grade of "C".
4. Completion of 15 hours in residency at the University of Mississippi (includes Tupelo & Desoto campuses)
5. Completion of courses taken by correspondence for admission to student teaching. The grade must be on file prior to admissions.
6. Evidence of professional liability insurance

General Requirements for Completing the B. A. E. in Social Studies Education:

1. At least 122 semester hours
2. At least 30 semester hours of residence credit in School of Education (includes The University of Mississippi – Tupelo, Desoto, Booneville, and Grenada)
3. Not more than 33 semester hours of correspondence and extension credit
4. Not more than 61 semester hours of transfer credit from community college to be applied toward the degree.
