Examples: If one of your minors is psychology, you may not use General Psychology as a social science in the core curriculum and towards your minor in psychology; American History I may not be used as an humanities in the core curriculum and towards your minor in history.

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Important Advice: Please try to complete all courses where it states in parenthesis (Courses taken at BSCC) prior to transferring to UM-Tupelo because we may not have these courses available on the Tupelo campus. You may take courses at BSCC where it states in parenthesis (Courses taken at BSCC or UM-Tupelo). However, please remember, that you **may transfer only 60 hours from community college**. Course selection at community college is very important. Please talk to your academic advisor at BSCC or one of our regional admissions counselors at UM-Tupelo if you have any questions regarding course selection prior to transfer.

NOTE: EACH BGS DEGREE MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

1. Satisfy all the requirements for each of three minors as defined by the departments offering the minor.
Note: General Studies requires at least a C- in all minors. Some minors require a C.
2. At least 30 hours of courses at the 300-level or above
3. At least 30 hours of courses taken in residence (UM Oxford, Booneville, Desoto, Grenada, Tupelo)
4. At least 120 hours total with each course satisfying only one degree requirement (core or minor or elective), with a cumulative resident and overall GPA of at least 2.0.
